## **Industrialised Agriculture**

Around 1950,

selective breeding of laying hens to produce more eggs, got underway.






This process produced a hen that, instead of laying two clutches of 12 eggs annually, lays an egg every day until, 280 - 300 eggs later, she is "spent".

## Industrialised agriculture

and the battery cages
that came with it,
launched an egg industry
that makes it possible to
keep 20 000 laying hens
and more, in one shed –
with just two labourers.

Chickens became units of production.



## Supermarket culture removed ordinary consumers from their sources of food.


Unbeknown to them,

debeaking, de-toeing and maceration
of just-hatched male chicks
(because they will never grow up to lay an egg),
became the norm.



Routine procedures like these on industrialised (factory) farms, are perpetrated in the name of feeding the nation cheaply.


#### 2. (I) Any person who

- (a) cruelly over loads, over drives, overrides, beats, kicks, goads, ill-treats, neglects, infuriates, terrifies, tortures or **maims** any animal; or
- (b) confines, chains, tethers or secures any animal unnecessarily or under such conditions or in such a manner or position as to cause that animal **unnecessary suffering** or in any place which affords **inadequate space**, ventilation, light, protection or shelter from heat, cold or weather;

**shall,** subject to the provisions of this Act and any other law, **be guilty of an offence** 

But more than 22 million laying hens, hidden from public view on factory farms across South Africa, are victims of these very crimes every day of their tormented lives.

Your letter dated 22.2.95 refers.

The Attorney-General carefully considered the complaint made by Mrs Louise van der Merwe of the then Humanity for Hens concerning Lemoenkloof Farms (Pty) Ltd. It was decided not to institute a prosecution because the Attorney-General does not consider that there is a reasonable prospect of success.

A test case would accordingly be inappropriate.

## Contravention of the South African Animals Protection Act : Inadequate space

The hens are **crammed** five in a cage, each with a space allowance less than the space in a shoe box.



## Contravention of the South African Animals Protection Act : Maiming

Unable to express normal behaviour, the **stressed** hens can resort to pecking their cage mates. For this reason, they are **debeaked**, or beak-trimmed – a euphemism preferred by the industry.





## Contravention of the South African Animals Protection Act: Unneccesary suffering

There is **no escape** from the **relentless roar** of massive fans built into the walls of the battery sheds. The fans attempt to remove **ammonia fumes** that result from a build-up of faeces.





For an average of **85 weeks**, until she's 'spent' of her 300-odd eggs, **the hen stands on wire** so that her faeces together with the faeces of some 20 000 others, falls through the wire into a deep pit below that gradually becomes a mountain of manure.



It is removed only in-between flocks, approximately every 85 weeks.

## However, the world is in transition.

In a series of articles titled The Cage Free Revolution published in the Poultry Bulletin (March 2017 volume 6, issue 3; April 2017 volume 6, issue 4 and March 2018, volume 7, issue 3), **South Africa's egg producers** were warned to prepare for the cage free revolution that is sweeping the world.





#### The article stated:

No amount of improved management can compensate for the welfare issues inherent in the (battery cage) system.





## Gallus Gallus Domesticus



It is ironic therefore, that the

South African Bureau of Standards,
as an agency of the Department of Trade and Industry
responsible for the promotion of standards and quality,
has published its new standard for laying hens
SANS 1758, which, if passed,

will keep them in the torment of battery cages until 2039 and beyond

## **Even the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE)**




World Organisation for Animal Health

an intergovernmental body coordinating, supporting and promoting animal disease control,

is set to adopt a new Chapter on laying hen welfare

at its annual general session in Paris in May.





## This Chapter states that it is desirable that laying hens be provided...

sufficient space for the expression of locomotory and comfort behaviours that contribute to good musculoskeletal health and plumage condition.



These behavior include walking, running, wing flapping, feather ruffling and preening.

Battery cages do not support the expression of any of these behaviours



In December 2016,

South Africa's Constitutional Court
